I love that we are different.


I love that despite our differences, we all love God and his people fiercely.

A SPECIAL THANKS TO . . .



The Regional Youth Commission is hard at work developing a fabulous weekend that will focus on Unity in Community and they're excited to have Keynote Speaker Rev. Rebecca Sumner (Everett's Common Table church) coming to share her talents and ministry with the retreat.

Extra! Extra!! Announced January 25

The Zephyr Heritage Fund Board has made its first grant toward the continuing enrichment of youth and outdoor ministry in the Northwest Region. With great generosity, they have announced that the Zephyr Heritage Fund will provide 1/2 scholarships for ALL youth attending the March 10-12 Youth Winter Retreat and all Adult Sponsors who attend will receive a 100% scholarship. You read that right! Fees for youth to attend the weekend event will be \$55 with the scholarship, and adult sponsors will not need to make any payment toward attending.

Registration requirements are still in effect - youth and adults must register by February 22, adults must have a current Adult Volunteer/Counselor application on file. If an over-payment is received, reimbursement of the appropriate amount will be processed as quickly as possible.

We hope the dramatically reduced cost to attend will encourage even more youth (6th-12th grades) to attend!



New Book in the Library

Walden

by Henry David Thoreau (reviewed by Mel Adams, Librarian)

In 1845, Henry David Thoreau moved into a cabin by Walden Pond near Concord Massachusetts. He cut himself off from human society and lived in the cabin for two years. His sojourn in the cabin was an exercise in self-sufficiency, independence but most of all it was a spiritual journey. Along with chapters describing the spiritual intimacy he developed with water, ice, trees, and all the creatures living in and




around the pond; he also kept a detailed accounting of his expenditures that were meager.

This quotation from Walden describes why he went to the pond and illustrates why he is one of the most gifted writers in American history and why Walden is a classic work of literature.

"I went to the woods because I wished to live deliberately, to front only the essential facts of life, and see if I could not learn what it had to teach, and not, when I came to die, discover that I had not lived. ..I wanted to live deep and suck out all the marrow of life..."
