Dear Friends,

I was reading through the sermon Fred Craddock preached at his brother Bill's funeral. It's a beautiful sermon (most of his sermons are), but there was one passage in particular that grabbed my attention. Fred must have been a seminary professor when he wrote it, because he was talking about his students, and how every once in a while, one would give up. Not all at once, like the aspiring pastor who suddenly decides he's



really meant to be a pastry chef. Or even like the one who, upon taking a few classes in biblical criticism, decides it's all a sham and transfers into the business program. No, this kind of giving up is much more gradual:

Zeal cools, faith weakens, appetite for Christian enterprises disappears, the springs dry up, the soul is parched, and you can see it in eyes grown dull and flat. What happened? Did evil storm his citadel and take over? No. Did much study drive him into doubt? No. Did attractive alternatives to ministry turn his head? No. Nothing quite so dramatic. He simply made the fatal error of assuming that spending so much time talking about God was adequate substitute for talking with God.

Though few of us spend our days as seminarians do, reading and writing about faith with such regularity that we might fool ourselves into thinking we're living it, we are still — in our own way — vulnerable to that same error. Even outside the walls of a seminary, we can fill our lives with enough church, enough righteous speech, enough volunteer hours, enough religious literature to make it *feel* as if we are faithful when in fact, we have forgotten the most critical component: a relationship with God. Now, don't get me wrong: Reading, writing, serving, and sharing the Good News in word and deed are all part of this endeavor of ours. But they aren't *all* of it. Finding time to give God thanks and praise, to say what's on your mind and to listen to what God is saying, to spend time in God's creation and to admire all that God has made — to enjoy the companionship of Life and Light and Love within you, around you, and beyond you — that cannot go undone. Not if we want the tender bud of faith to bloom and grow.

As we enter into 2018, my prayer for all of us — those whose faith is woven into every fiber of their being to those who find it fugitive and hard to hold onto — is that we claim the resolve, the desire, and the space for a conversation with God this year. For one who calls us is faithful (1 Thess. 5:24). Let's answer.




In September the church board and the Elders approved a proposal for Rick Donahoe to serve as an intern for the church for the calendar year 2018. This internship is a part of Rick's education along with studying at Whitworth University for a Master's degree in Theology. Beginning in January, Rick will work for ~10 hours a week focusing on church leadership, pastoral care, outreach and mission, and worship.

As an intern Rick will not be employed by the church. He will be supervised by Pastor Liv during his internship. The Elders will "walk alongside" him during this time. Rick will continue to serve as an Elder and as the church treasurer.

Rick, who retired from the Reading Foundation in December, is currently in a period of discernment, listening and praying about how God wants to use him in the future.


