## **JANUARY INTERN'S CORNER**



### What is Epiphany?

Epiphany, or the 12th day of Christmas, falls on January 6 and marks the official end to the festive season for many Christians. The word 'Epiphany' comes from Greek and means to show, referring to Jesus being revealed to the world. The Twelfth Night (Epiphany) marks a visit to the baby Jesus by three Kings, or Wise Men. In the West, Christians began celebrating the Epiphany in the 4th century, associating it with the visit of the Wise Men to Jesus.

The three men - named Melchior, Caspar and Balthazar - followed the star of Bethlehem to meet the baby Jesus. According to Matthew 2:11, they offered symbolic gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. The gifts were symbolic of the importance of Jesus' birth- the gold representing his royal standing; frankincense his divine birth; and myrrh his mortality. The three Kings represented Europe, Arabia and Africa respectively. (*excerpts taken from the Telegraph.com*)

Epiphany is also known as the *Manifestation of Christ* to the Gentiles as represented by the Magi (Matthew 2:1–12).

#### **A LETTER FROM YOUR SEARCH & CALL COMMITTEE**

On behalf of the **Search and Call Committee**, I would like to wish all of you a Happy New Year! Below is a short status of the Committee's activities as well as an invitation for a **Congregational Workshop after worship this coming Sunday, January 13th**.

As many of you know from announcements over the past



month, **Reverend Peter Kalunian** has accepted the church's offer for the **Interim Minister** position. Peter is a retired Episcopalian minister, who came to us through our Regional Minister Sandy Messick. Peter served the Episcopalian church in Kennewick before he and his wife moved to the west side for several years, where he continued his ministry. After retiring, they returned to the Tri-Cities. Peter has remained active in the community and has served as president of the Rotary Club of Tri -Cities. He brings years of experience and a deep devotion to ministry. We are both excited and honored that he will serve as our interim minister while we continue our search for a settled pastor.

**Peter will start as Interim Minister in February**. In late January, he is travelling to Belize as part of a mission group. (He and his family perform this mission annually.) Before they leave on the trip, however, **he will visit with the congregation this Sunday, January 13.** We hope all of you will be able to attend church and introduce yourself.

After service, the Search Committee will be conducting our second workshop with the congregation. This workshop, just like the first one that many of you attended in November, will be led by Joanna Flaten and focuses on who we are / where we are going / what we want to do as a church. The answers to these questions will help to determine what we are looking for in a settled pastor. Please join us in the Fellowship Hall for a soup luncheon, meaningful conversation and wonderful fellowship.

And finally...We continue our search for the settled pastor... Your input this Sunday will be compiled into a *written Congregational Profile* that fully describes Northwest United Protestant Church. Once the Congregational Profile is completed, we will work with the Regional Minister to identify candidates for this position. Typically, the *search process takes anywhere from six months to a year.* (If you have any questions about the Committee's process, please reach out to one of our members.)

Thank you again for this sacred trust that you have placed in us.



stepped in so graciously to provide a helping hand. What a great Family Advent Dinner it was and we are thankful for the opportunity to celebrate Advent with our church family.






#### **DECORATING THE SANCTUARY**



#### Little Dancer Aged Fourteen by Camille Laurens

This book is one of the little gems I occasionally find. It is well written and meticulously researched, but it reveals a truth that is somewhat disturbing. The book is about Marie van Goethem, a little girl who was the subject of Degas's famous sculpture titled Little Dancer Aged Fourteen. Marie was a dancer at the Paris Opera in the late 1800's.

Like many of the child dancers in the opera called "rats", Marie was poor and abused by the opera. They were worked day and night in training or in performance. Except for a very few who became stars, the rats were paid very little and were preyed upon by older men who were patrons of the ballet. Many of the "rats" became prostitutes or died early in obscurity.

Marie was also a model for the artist Degas. He was a man of privilege in France. His unusual wax sculpture of Marie is a world famous piece of art as were his many paintings of the young girls in the ballet.

Author Laurens takes us on an in-depth exploration of Marie and Degas including the realities of her life, his motivations and artistic skill. Laurens was able to find out little about Marie, and she remains largely a mystery. Here is what the author said about Marie and Degas, "...he is famous and you are unknown. In reality ...the two of you are, at the same time dead and eternal. You will always be fourteen years old, always three feet tall, like a three-year-old."

I love this book because it tells us how an artist takes an unknown, poor little girl and gives her a soul that through his art becomes immortal. It reminds me of the Christ story because he also was born in poverty and became immortal.
