May 1, 2020

During the month of May, I will be preaching a sermon series on Disciples' identity, focusing on themes found in the identity statement for the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).

The identity statement reads:

"We are a movement for wholeness in a fragmented world. As part of the one body of Christ, we welcome all to the Lord's table as God has welcomed us."

Each week I will focus on different words found in the identity statement – movement, wholeness, fragmented world, unity, the Lord's table and God's welcome to all.

What does it mean to be a Disciple/disciple? The word disciple means someone who follows the teaching of another. Our identity as Christians is centered around Christ, who invites us to follow him daily. We also see the word disciple in the word discipline. What do you think of when you hear the word discipline? Like many, you probably don't like the word discipline. Maybe it reminds you of school, and too many rules!

In reality, discipline is not a bad thing. It offers us a way order our lives and make sense of the chaos. In Acts 2:42 we learn that the early disciples ordered their lives by devoting themselves to "the apostle's teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of the bread and the prayers." We too can order our lives around these things; read a favorite scripture during the day, give thanks as you eat a meal, reach out to others (virtually) in fellowship... in other words, be a disciple!
