



A "Gentle" Reminder



Dear NWUP members and friends:

July is the month when our national collective thoughts usually turn to fireworks and freedom, grilled hot dogs and hamburgers. Living in Washington DC for many years, I was surrounded by displays of fireworks every fourth of July. From the roof of my rowhouse I could see multiple

flashes of lights throughout the city, including the famous display over the Washington Monument and the Lincoln Memorial. Another iconic image on this national holiday is the Statue of Liberty with torch held high and bursts of fireworks behind the crowned head, a beacon of light to the world.

Although I was born in New York City, I grew up in Miami, Florida, a child of Cuban immigrants who came to this country to find a new life and new opportunities. I was fortunate to grow up in two worlds, learning two cultures and two languages. This country was certainly a beacon of hope and freedom for my Cuban relatives as it has been for so many other immigrant communities. I remember as a young child of seven, serving as an interpreter for my grandparents, newly arrived in Miami from Cuba. I learned early on that this country's strength lies in the ways it has been a haven for so many.

We are a country made stronger by the input of our immigrant communities, people whose dream is to prosper and live a life full of opportunities.

As a nation we share a common heritage of freedom. As Christians, we also share a common heritage of freedom in Christ. We share God's dream of a world where our lives are lived fully in God's kingdom vision of peace and justice, and wholeness. In John 10:10, Jesus says, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." God's vision is a vision of shalom for all creation, and as followers of Jesus, we are called to live out this vision, for ourselves, and for our community, our nation and our world.

How are you living out God's vision of shalom? How are you helping others find their best life?

Like my ancestors who came to the United States seeking peace, freedom, and opportunity, I wish those same things for others.

I'm sure you are familiar with the words engraved on the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty, words of welcome to immigrants coming to the United States of America. Emma Lazarus was commissioned to write a poem to help raise funds for the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty. Although she initially declined, she later wrote a sonnet commemorating the plight of immigrants. Several, now famous lines, from that poem, "The New Colossus," written in 1883, were engraved on the pedestal of the Statue of Liberty in 1903.

Enjoy your fourth of July holiday! Stay safe, and remember to wear your mask!

Not like the brazen giant of Greek fame,
With conquering limbs astride from land to land;
Here at our sea-washed, sunset gates shall stand
A mighty woman with a torch, whose flame
Is the imprisoned lightning, and her name
Mother of Exiles. From her beacon-hand
Glows world-wide welcome; her mild eyes command
The air-bridged harbor that twin cities frame.
"Keep, ancient lands, your storied pomp!" cries she
With silent lips. "Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.
Send these, the homeless, tempest-tost to me,
I lift my lamp beside the golden door!"

CONTRIBUTION REQUEST TO SUPPORT THE PURCHASE OF A NEW SOUND SYSTEM

During this pandemic, we have found that the best way for us to protect our members and practice social distancing for our Sunday service is church in the parking lot. We are currently borrowing a sound system from another congregation in this area. However, after a great deal of research by the Audio Visual Commission, it has been determined that for approximately \$1200 - \$1500, Northwest United Protestant Church can purchase a sound system that would be used in our drive-in services as well as in the Fellowship Hall or the patio when we have events and the speakers can be used as backup for the older speakers we currently have in the sanctuary. After much discussion, your leadership team is recommending that we purchase a new sound system. Several volunteers have already stepped forward and contributed funding to help purchase the new sound system. We are asking anyone else in the congregation who is willing to support this effort to please send a check to the church marked "For the Sound System". Thank you for your consideration of this request for our church.




