Ministry Report



In many ways, it seems that 2021 was just a repeat of the previous year. Covid weariness briefly lifted as vaccines became available, but pandemic fatigue continued and seemed to become worse as the virus variants and vaccine hesitancy created division and discord in the greater community. Fortunately, Northwest has followed all Covid protocols and has offered both safe in person worship and online worship throughout the year. In 2021, I offered pastoral leadership in many ways, including the following initiatives:

- Offered monthly Bible study through Zoom on various topics
- Offered weekly worship on Sunday mornings in person and online
- Continued to encourage the congregation to follow Covid protocols, including wearing masks when gathering in person, and to be vaccinated
- Introduced a narrative budget to compliment the regular budget offered during the annual meeting
- Participated in the music ministry of the church (handbell choir and harp)
- Officiated a baby dedication for Cambria Humphrys in March 2021
- Officiated two memorial services (Connie Eckard, Joyce Jakes)
- With the moderator, reviewed tenant leases and ensured Covid protocols were being followed
- Offered a joint Maundy Thursday service on Zoom with Shalom UCC
- Organized a church clean up and paint day in April
- Participated in the quarterly Columbia Area Disciples Clergy gathering
- Participated in the Northern Lights Regional Transformation Team (monthly)
- Offered pastoral care through in person meetings, phone calls, and emails
- Trained a new secretary
- Participated (virtually) in the ordination of Rev. Jennifer Jacobson
- Organized and planned (with Worship Commission and others) the Fall Fling outdoor service
- Oversaw the process for NWUP becoming a Green Chalice Congregation

- Encouraged the creation of an endowment fund through Christian Church Foundation
- Encouraged new voices to participate in pulpit supply and Bible study

Northwest continues to face financial challenges that will need to be addressed for the continuing health of the congregation. Each challenge is an opportunity for growth. During the November congregational meeting, I challenged the congregation to take seriously the need to invite others to worship. Northwest is a faithful congregation that seeks to serve God through their gift of hospitality. It is a congregation where people can come with questions, and doubts, and know that they will be welcomed and embraced with care. Northwest has so much to offer but we need to do a better job of telling others!! The challenges presented during 2021 have been many, but the goal of the church remains, to serve others and to bring others into the joy of God's generous and abundant love.

Looking ahead briefly, during 2022, a visioning team will be formed to help the

Diaconate



In 2021 the full Diaconate was not used. In its place, Northwest United Protestant Church continued to follow COVID Protocol. The Protocol required us to establish seating requirements that maintained a six foot distance between non-family church attendees. At the beginning of 2021, we were allowed to remove our masks after we were seated but with the Delta Variant of COVID, the Benton-Franklin Health District advised us to maintain masking throughout the service (exception being to take communion).

Northwest United Protestant Church had established a "Greeter" and one or two "Ushers," from the Diaconate These individuals ensured church attendees were masked and properly seated. Also, church attendees names were recorded (and maintained for three weeks) to allow contact in case of a COVID exposure. The Greeter was gloved and masked to hand out individual communion cups with bread wafers included (traditional communion with shared bread and juice were not used to minimize any spread of the COVID virus).

Northwest United Protestant Church expects to continue following the COVID Protocol and continue to use a Greeter and Ushers through 2022.

Treasurer Report



This 2021 report encompasses the fiscal year for NWUP Church. NWUP changed our outsourced professional bookkeeper from Teri Galloway, Balanced Books, to Dianna Lopez, Bookkeeper4Me, LLC. This transition was mutually agreeable to all governing groups of the church.

<u>Income</u> - Total contributions were \$115,951. compared to budgeted contributions of \$113,262. Total overall income includes building use rents of

\$6,505, for a total income of \$141,312. Income was \$28,049. over our actual budget.

Expenses - Actual expenses were \$ 142,732. Net income- Annual total expenses exceeded income by -\$ 1,419.

<u>Current Assets</u> - The Checking account, Money Market account, Savings account, three Certificates of Deposit and an Investment at Christian Church Foundation give us our total assets at \$129,515.

Our Building (given it's value by our insurance) and land value for the two lots, the educational building, the sanctuary and roof & HVAC gives us our fixed assets of \$1,624,366.

<u>Reporting</u> - Status reports with balance sheet, profit & loss statement and budget report to the Stewardship and Finance Committee and church board are submitted monthly. These reports are prepared with the assistance of our professional bookkeepers.

<u>Regulatory Reporting</u> - All necessary payments and reports for employment taxes are taken care of via QuickBooks software, by the bookkeeper. Copies of such reports are retained with each month's records. The annual reports to the WA Secretary of State and Department of Revenue for 2021 have been submitted in January 2022 meeting our due dates. This meets our requirements to maintain our non-profit status. Copies of these documents are retained in our archives.



Stewardship and Finance Commission



Mike Dodson was welcomed as a member of our committee in January. During early 2021, we completed revision and approval of the gifts policy (Bluebook section 6.3). We added second account with the Christian Church Foundation as a self-managed endowment fund subject to State regulations. We expect to begin drawing 4% on a permanent basis from the two CCF accounts beginning in 2022.

The current bookkeeper planned to retire and a new one was identified to begin in 2022. Our concerns with a

possible 2021 budget planning shortfall did not prove to be a significant issue after reevaluation midyear.

We considered changes to financial software, but decided it was best to continue use of Simple Church for tracking membership donations. However, we expect to go back to the standalone version of Quickbooks instead of the cloud implementation to save some expenses beginning in 2022.

One more of our \$10K CDs was rolled into checking during this year to deal with continuing cashflow issues. We also decided to change the mid-year reporting of individual member donations to our congregation to be optional rather than required. Older, unspent memorial funds were identified to be rolled into the general fund. We also recommended Flourish Mid- Columbia begin paying a modest rate for their office space. There was discussion throughout the year on changes to improve our cashflow.

We began placing more information on planned giving in the information for churchgoers. We are also planning a retirement/legacy planning class in Spring 2022. The annual stewardship and budget planning concluded with 2022 budget passage in November. This year also incorporated a descriptive narrative budget component.
